- 90(5) To consider the Letter No.K-12052-1/5/2017-LH (5474) dated 23.3.2026 received from the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi seeking clarification regarding shortage of Professors in respect of the inspection report of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Kishanganj, Bihar under Bihar Animal Science University, Patna together with the recommendations made by the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026.

The Council considered the Letter No.K-12052-1/5/2017-LH (5474) dated 23.3.2026 received from the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi seeking clarification regarding shortage of Professors in respect of the inspection report of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Kishanganj, Bihar under Bihar Animal Science University, Patna.

The Council noted that there are 08 vacant posts of Professor in 13 Departments, whereas in the Council meeting 04 posts of Professors were mentioned as vacant and the same was communicated to the Department. It was discussed that as per the Inspection Report also vacant of 8 posts of Professors has been mentioned and the clarification also given by the University vide letter dated 21/4/2026 about vacancy of 8 posts of Professors.

After detailed deliberations, it was decided that the Department may be informed to consider the vacant posts of Professors as 8 instead of 4 in response to Department's Letter dated 23.3.2026.

- 90(6) To consider the Letter No.K/12/2025-LH (37089) dated 27th March, 2026 received from Central Government forwarding therewith representation of Shri Ram Nath Educational & Welfare Society, Fatehabad (Haryana) regarding issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI) for Apex institute of Veterinary Education & Research, Fatehabad, Haryana for B.V.Sc.&A.H degree programme for the academic session (2026-27) together with the recommendations made by the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026.

The Council considered the Letter No.K/12/2025-LH (37089) dated 27th March, 2026 received from Central Government forwarding therewith representation of Shri Ram Nath Educational & Welfare Society, Fatehabad (Haryana) regarding issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI) for Apex institute of Veterinary Education & Research, Fatehabad, Haryana for B.V.Sc.&A.H degree programme for the academic session (2026-27) together with the recommendations made by the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026.

The Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026 decided as under:

"The Executive Committee considered the Letter No.K/12/2025-LH (37089) dated 27th March, 2026 received from Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi forwarding therewith representation of Shri Ram Nath Educational & Welfare Society, Fatehabad (Haryana) regarding issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI) for Apex institute of Veterinary Education & Research, Fatehabad, Haryana for B.V.Sc.&A.H degree programme for the academic session (2026-27).

The Committee noted that the Administrative Department has condoned the delay in submission and decision to reconsider the compliance letter submitted by the applicant institutions.

The Committee also noted the provision of Rule 7(10) of VCI Rules, 2017, which provides that "Where the Council recommends to the Central Government against the issue of Letter of Intent to the applicant, it shall submit its reasons for such recommendation in writing and the Central Government may, decide to issue a Letter

of Intent to the applicant despite the recommendation to the contrary received from the Council."

In view of aforesaid provisions of the Rules and taking into account the time schedule as specified in VCI Rules, 2017, the Executive Committee decided that the Administrative Department may be requested for taking appropriate decision in the matter and issue of Letter of Intent (LOI) as per Rule 7(10) of VCI Rules, 2017 and if the Central Government consider for issue of LOI, then this Council shall conduct an inspection before recommendation for issue of Letter of Permission (LOP) to the applicant College."

After detailed deliberations, the Council approved the aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee.

The Council considered the Letter No.K-12052-1/2/2025-LH(34372) dated 21/4/2026 received from the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Government of India regarding Re-examination of proposal for establishment of Ideal Veterinary College, Singhani (Bhiwani), Haryana for the academic session 2026-27 together with the recommendations made by the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026.

The Executive Committee in its meeting held on 24/4/2026 decided as under:

"The Executive Committee considered the Letter No.K-12052-1/2/2025-LH(34372) dated 21/4/2026 received from the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Government of India regarding re-examination of proposal for establishment of Ideal Veterinary College, Singhani (Bhiwani), Haryana for the academic session 2026-27.

The Executive Committee noted that as per VCI Rules, 2017, the last date for re-submission of application after removal of defects by the applicant college was 15th October, 2025 as per Schedule-I of VCI Rules, 2017 for the purpose of issue of LOP for the academic session 2026-27. In the present case, the Administrative Department has not condoned in delay of submission of application.

Hence, Executive Committee after detailed deliberations and looking at the order dated 26.11.2025 of the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana, decided that if the Department allow/condoned this Council for acceptance of delayed application beyond the prescribed date, then this Council shall take appropriate decision in the matter."

After detailed deliberations, the Council approved the aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee.

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From the aforesaid visitor report, it was observed by the Council that the college is still deficient in terms of teaching manpower. As per Visitor Report, college is deficient in terms of 09 Professors, 01 Assoc. Professor, 12 Asstt. Professors and 02 Farm Managers.

The Council further observed that college was deficient in terms of teaching manpower since 2021 as the college was also inspected by this Council during the period from 23-25 September, 2021 and that time there was shortage of 17 Prof, 12 Assoc. Prof. and 12 Asstt. Professor. In view of aforesaid deficiencies, the Council vide letter dated 11.8.2022 recommended to the Central Government for de-recognition of qualification in respect of aforesaid College. The college was again inspected through visitor during September, 2024 and it was again observed that at that time the college was deficient in terms of 11 Professors, 09 Assoc. Professors and 12 Asstt. Professors. In view of aforesaid deficiencies, the Council vide letter dated 20.3.2025 again requested the Central Government for stopping of admission for the academic session 2025-26 and withdrawal of BVSc & AH qualification in respect of the said College.

However, Administrative Department vide letter dated 22.9.2025 not accepted the recommendation of VCI in respect of aforesaid college and admission for academic year 2025-26 was permitted in view of Chief Secretary, Government of Tripura assurance given to fulfil the requirement as per VCI – MSVE Regulations, 2016 at the aforesaid College.

However, Council observed that in spite of assurance by the Government of Tripura, college is still deficient in terms of teaching manpower. Continuous shortage of teaching manpower is leading to compromise with quality of veterinary education being imparted at that College which shall not be in the interest of veterinary education. Hence, after detailed deliberations, it was decided to recommend to the Central Government for stopping of admission to BVSc & AH course at the College of Veterinary Science, Tripura for the academic session 2026-27 and a copy of the letter shall also be given to the authorities of the State Government and University. A copy of visitor report shall also be sent to the Central Government as well as authorities of University and State Government for their information.

90(9) To consider the Visitor Report of the College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Ranchi under Birsa Agricultural University, Ranchi conducted from 15 – 16 April, 2026.

From the aforesaid visitor report, it was observed by the Council that the college is still deficient in terms of teaching manpower. As per Visitor Report, college is deficient in terms of 15 Professors, 08 Assoc. Professor, 12 Asstt. Professors and 02 Farm Managers..

The Council further observed that college was deficient in terms of teaching manpower since 2021 as the college was also inspected by this Council during the period from 13-15 September, 2021 and that time there was shortage of 14 Prof, 16 Assoc. Prof, 11 Asstt. Professor and 02 Farm Manager. In view of aforesaid deficiencies, the Council vide letter dated 11.8.2022 recommended to the Central Government for de-recognition of qualification in respect of aforesaid College. The college was again inspected through visitor during 26-28 September, 2024 and it was again observed that at that time the college was deficient in terms of 12 Professors and 06 Assoc. Professors. In view of aforesaid deficiencies, the Council vide letter dated 09.5.2025 again requested the Central Government for stopping of admission for academic session 2025-26 and withdrawal of BVSc & AH qualification in respect of the said College.

However, Administrative Department vide letter dated 19.9.2025 not accepted the recommendation of VCI in respect of aforesaid college and admission for academic year 2025-26 was permitted in view of Secretary(AHD), Government of Jharkahd assurance given to fulfil the requirement as per VCI – MSVE Regulations, 2016 at the aforesaid college.



However, Council observed that in spite of assurance by the Government of Jharkhand, college is still deficient in terms of teaching manpower. Continuous shortage of teaching manpower is leading to compromise with quality of veterinary education being imparted at that College which shall not be in the interest of veterinary education. Hence, after detailed deliberations, it was decided to recommend to the Central Government for stopping of admission to BVSc & AH course at the College of Veterinary Science, Ranchi under Birsa Agricultural University for the academic session 2026-27 and a copy of the letter shall also be given to the authorities of the State Government and University. A copy of visitor report shall also be sent to the Central Government as well as authorities of University and State Government for their information.

After detailed discussion, Council decided as under:

1. The shortage of above teaching faculty shall be filled up immediately by the Management of the College.
2. The Council noted that as the affiliating University has started online attendance in respect of teaching faculties appointed at the College on link and control basis. Hence, Registrar of the affiliating University (RAJUVAS, Jobner, Jaipur) shall be requested to furnish online attendance in respect of teaching faculties available at that College for the last six months to this Council for immediately for taking further decision in the matter.
3. Management of the College shall be directed to provide a copy of online attendance as captured by the affiliating University for the last six months in respect of teaching faculty duly authenticated by the Registrar of the University to this Council within 15 days from the issue of letter by this Council in this regard.
4. A copy of Visitor Report shall be sent to the College for their information.

4. If the, University/ State Government fails to appoint required number of teaching posts by the end of July, 2026 this Council shall recommend to the Central Government for stopping admission to the BVSc & AH course at the said College from the academic session 2026-27.

Hence, after detailed deliberations, Council decided to seek legal opinion on this issue from Ministry of Law & Justice, Government of India through Administrative Ministry.

After detailed deliberations, the Council agreed to allow migration of Mr. Angad Deep Singh from ACVM, Jaipur to COVSc, Ludhiana provided that physical copy of medical certificate issued by the Board will be considered by the Council under Rule 10(4) of MSVE Regulations, 2016.
